## **LOCATION/SHIFT:**

North County BHRS (NCMH BHRS), the adult outpatient regional clinic for the Northern region of the County has a transfer/reassignment opportunity for a Community Mental Health Nurse. North County BHRS – Adult is one of the 5 regional outpatient clinics, serving adults with serious mental illness. The opportunity is for 1 FTE position. The shift for the full time position is 8:00 am-5:00 pm, Monday through Friday.

The position has the following primary duties:

- Care Coordinator for clients receiving medication therapy
  - Conducts admission and annual assessments
  - Develop, implement and evaluate client care plans
  - Provide crisis intervention as needed

- Link clients to case management and therapy services as needed
- Hold a caseload of individual clients with comorbid medical conditions, providing case management and skill building support.
- Primary liaison between psychiatry, primary care and/or specialty medical care for clients with complex medical co-morbidities
- Provide medication management support and nursing services to clients on psychotropic medications. This includes:
  - Routine review and monitoring of lab results
  - Screen and triage pharmacy and community provider medication-related phone calls and correspondences
  - Screen and triage clients medication related questions and concerns
  - Administer injections, provide oral medication support
  - Administer TB tests
  - Work with clients on an individual or group basis on improving health and supporting wellness

The ideal candidate will have experience working with a high-volume caseload; have a BSN and one year full time psychiatric nursing experience in an acute care or outpatient setting working with clients with diagnosed mental illness. A candidate with a Master's in Psychiatric Nursing is preferred but not required.
